Dr. Perkins received his medical degree from the University of Witwatersrand Medical School in Johannesburg, South Africa, and completed his internship in internal medicine and surgery followed by his residency in internal medicine at Johannesburg Hospital. In 1983, he was a staff physician at the Veterans Administration Medical Center in Dallas and in 1984 was a senior resident in internal medicine at St. Paul Medical Center in Dallas.

In 1987, Dr. Perkins was a fellow in oncology/hematology at UT Southwestern Medical School in Dallas and, in 1990, was an instructor at UT Southwestern Medical School in the Department of Internal Medicine. From 1990 to 1992, Dr. Perkins was the Director of the Autologous Bone Marrow Transplant Unit at Zale-Lipsky Hospital in Dallas, and prior to joining Texas Oncology, was in private practice.
